The Graduate Program is a cooperation of the TUA with Driestar Christian University.

Thus, the Graduate Program is not only accessible and apt for residential students, but also for international students and for those who pursue a PhD next to their day jobs.

Setup

The setup of the yearly coursework within the Graduate Program is as follows:

- In the first year, the coursework is centered on methodology (general and specific for the discipline), the formulation of a research question and research methods;
- The second year offers training in academic writing skills and English language training;
- In the third year, the practicalities of the defense of a PhD thesis are discussed;
- In the fourth year, the candidate presents his/her own dilemma's to be discussed.

Meanwhile, supervision takes place through regular interaction between supervisor and the PhD student.

Requirements

To enroll in the Graduate Program, prospective students must:

- have earned a Master's degree, preferably in theology;
- be able to spend at least 10 hours per week on their PhD;
- submit a proposal before June 1st of the calendar year in which they wish to start the Program (starting end of August). Guidelines for the proposal are found on the website of the university;
- take an interview (possibly via Skype) in July.

PhD students will be supervised by committed and inspiring professors in the fields of:

- Biblical Studies (Prof. Eric Peels);
- Systematic Theology (Prof. Arnold Huijgen);
- Church History (Prof. Herman Selderhuis);
- Practical Theology (Prof. Maarten Kater);
- Education (Prof. Bram de Muijnck).
